



Working with the Boss


Some basics about getting off to a good start with the boss:

- Think challenges, not excuses
- Underpromise / overdeliver
- Go the extra mile
- Learn when to ask permission and when to ask for forgiveness



Co-Workers



Some basics about getting off to a good start with co-workers.

- First, demonstrate competence
- Listen and learn from their experience
- Give everyone the benefit of the doubt
- Look for the good in all people
- Dealing with cliques
- Avoid the gossipy ones they are career killers
- Lead by example



Customers

Customers expect to be treated with great respect and even deference.
Give it to them.



- The health of your employer's business (and thus your job) depends on treating the customer well
- "The customer is always right" is the proper starting place
 - Even when you think the customer is wrong, you treat them as if they were correct
 - If possible, make accommodations to do things the customer wants
 - Learn your limits of accommodating a customer, and when the customer insists on more, take it to your supervisor
